





GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 23 Required Credits
- Promotion requirements
 - 9th to 10th: 5 credits (1 credit each Lit, Math,
 Science)
 - 10th to 11th: 10 credits (2 credits each Lit, Math,
 Science)
 - IIth to I2th: I6 credits and have met all other promotion requirements

1 common set of requirements for all students

23 total units required for all students

English Language Arts 4 units required for all students (Must include 9th Lit and American Lit)

Mathematics 4 units required for all students

Science 4 units required for all students including: (Biology), (Physical Science or Physics), (Chemistry or Earth Systems or Environmental Science or an AP science course) and one additional science unit (the 4th science unit may be used to meet both the science and elective requirements)

Social Studies 3 units required for all students including World History, US History, Economics and Government (Humanities is strongly encouraged for all college bound students)

1/2 unit of Health and 1/2 unit of Personal Fitness

World Language and/or Career Tech (CTAE) and/or Fine Arts A total of 3 units required (students planning to attend a school in the GA University System and many other private and out of state universities must take at least two units of the same world language)

4 additional elective units for all students

HONOR CARD, ACADEMIC LETTER, HONOR SOCIETIES, SERVICE CORD

- Honor Card- 3.0 weighted and higher (by semester)
- Academic Letter- 4.0 for fall and spring semester **EMAIL YOUR COUNSELOR IF THIS APPLIES TO YOU
- National Honor Society- 3.9 weighted and higher (invitations given out in fall- 11th and 12th)
- Service Cord- If students accumulate 200
 hours of community service before
 graduation, they will receive a cord to wear
 during the graduation ceremony *Can use
 hours from previous school *Covid flexible,
 see counseling website for handout
